hen the Figliulos walked into the 7700 South Throop Street model block bungalow in October 2006, no one was aware that they were the former owners of the home during the 1950s and 1960s.

Infatuated by the charm and warmth their home still exhibited some 50 years later, in addition to the contemporary green enhancements, the Figliulos began to share many stories with visitors participating in the Open House. Such stories included: their old phone number Hudson 3-7806, roller skating in the basement, neighborhood gatherings, and laundry techniques to include hand ringer washing and clothespin drying in the back yard. Jim (son) said their phone number was easy to remember as they mimicked the TV carpet commercial, Hudson 3-2700.

Other stories included: Rob (son) hanging from a pipe and jumping into a pile of laundry and running into the brick front porch leaving a life-long memory etched on his head; Jim attending Quigley South High School with Fr. Michael Pfleger of St. Sabina Church; the boys playing little league baseball at the park on 77th & Racine; explaining how the house was originally heated with a coal furnace and later upgraded to an oil burner; and their grandfather "Poppy" building an additional bathroom in the basement to accommodate a household of eleven. Poppy also restored the two stained-glass windows in the living room.

Two months later, to illustrate their kindness and to mend difficult times of the 1960's in Auburn Gresham, the Figliulo family (Peggy—mom, Jim, Rob, Steve, and Michael) presented several gifts along with a ceremonial key to Cory Williams, his fiancée, Evelyn Graham, and their daughter Kennedi in their new home. Home again, Mrs. Figliulo was ecstatic to hear the innocent chatter of Kennedi's voice and responded, "Oh my God, what a pretty little girl you have on your

As the heartfelt moments continued, Rob talked about the sudden, unpleasant transformation in Auburn Gresham in the 1960's and said, "It's been very healthy for us all to recognize the injustice caused to the community. These injustices were hurtful to each but have faded in intensity over the years. It's really great to be home again."

"The Figliulo's kindness is especially important in the Auburn Gresham community," said Carlos Nelson, Executive Director of the Greater Auburn Development Corporation (GADC). "It bridges the gap between racial and ethnic disparities while simultaneously providing the ultimate neighbor to neighbor experience."

No matter or whatever these families lost or gain as a result of this home, they have unified and positioned themselves and others for more enlightening, healing and defining moments to come.

Chicago Police Department. This critical information is also communicated through Auburn-Gresham residents for review.

During the onsite investigation, the city services and departments actually performed their duties while inspecting the area for adverse or unwarranted happenings. As part of the investigation each department reports their findings back to the parties involved for ongoing surveillance (if needed) and closure
