Student Interns Help to Improve Auburn Gresham's Landscape

Spnsored by the Office of the Mayor of the City of Chicago, Chicago Department of Children & Youth Services, and Chicago Local Initiative Support Corporation (LISC/Chicago), this year's Summer Youth Internship Program provided jobs for nearly 200 youth, ages 14-21, in the Auburn Gresham community.

In partnership with St. Sabina Employment Resource Center (ERC), the Greater Auburn-Gresham

Development Corporation (GADC) assisted with the interviewing and placement of these youth.

GADC hired 12 youth whom helped to further implement their pilot Litter Free Zone Initiative (LFZI).

The goal of the LFZI is three-fold. First this pilot program seeks to develop a creative solution to deter littering in our community while promoting recycling. This key objective focuses on educating and utilizing the youth to perpetuate a positive habit of

trash disposal and keeping our community clean. Emphasis is also given to recycling and protecting our environment.

The Greater Auburn-Gresham Development Corporation (GADC) in collaboration with local businesses have been searching for financial options to support efforts to improve the exterior appearance of commercial-use buildings located on the 79th Street Business District or Special Service Area #32 (SSA #32). To address this issue, GADC has partnered with Local Initiatives Support Corporation of Chicago (LISC/Chicago), Harris Bank, and SSA# 32 to launch a pilot Façade Enhancement Program.

This façade enhancement pilot program targets eight local business owners located on 79th Street between Carpenter and Morgan that have been in existence for more than 25 years.

The extended boundaries of the pilot program includes a two block area along west 79th Street, between Carpenter and Sangamon. The current businesses include a dental office, daycare center, local lounge, funeral home, barber shop and hardware store.

GADC recruited one high school and four college graduate interns to work with this project. McBride Kelly and Bauer Architecture firm has been retained to oversee and develop the architectural designs for this project. Components of this project include façade and banner designs, and architectural research of buildings located within the 79th

street business district.

Taking Back What Belongs to Our Youth

Over 300 youth and adults attended The Ark of St. Sabina's first annual summer violence prevention program, "The Take

Back." This summit was the brain child of Jocelyn Jones, Auburn Gresham's Liaison for the state of Illinois' Safety Net Works.

The program opened with a presentation by Hip Hop

Detoxx (HHD). HHD used music to engage the youth in a series of exercises designed to produce self-examination, self-analysis, and self correction.

Following HHD, there was a special presentation by 11th District Police Department entitled, "Keeping it Real." This highly acclaimed presentation gave rehabilitated offenders the opportunity to serve as panelists and share their stories with youth and encourage them to walk a straight path.

The summit also had a variety of age appropriate workshops for children and adults. Throughout the event, service and violence prevention organizations distributed

information about employment opportunities and programs that were available to youth.

The Safety Net Works is an initiative of the State of Illinois' Department of Human Services (IDHS) designed to prevent further tragic loss of life of our youth here in Illinois. Auburn Gresham's Safety Net Work Coalition has several community stakeholders intimately involved in advocacy and grassroots efforts to stop the violence here in our community.

GADC is also a coalition member in the Safety Net Works of Auburn Gresham.
