

he Greater Auburn-Gresham Development Corporation (GADC) participated in Local Initiatives Support Corporation of Chicago's (LISC/Chicago) New Communities Program (NCP) annual conference (Chicago Rising: What a Community Can Be) which featured as the keynote speaker, Adolfo Carrion Jr.

Recently named by President Barack Obama as the director of the new White House Office of Urban Affairs, Carrion engaged nearly 500 conference attendees about the importance of urban renewal and revival.

Carrion remarks were of much value to attendees as he shared his personal aspirations of "taking urban America out of the desert it's been in for the past eight years."

Previous to his new position, Carrion headed New York's Bronx Borough fo-

cusing on housing and development of at least 25,000 dwellings and worked for New York's planning department. He also served on the New York City Council.

The following day of the conference, Carrion toured Auburn Gresham's proposed Winneconna Transit Oriented Development, the Litter Free Zone piloted area, and the Oglesby Elementary School Yard Project, highlighting an unusual amount of foreclosed homes around this school. Carrion also visited the Auburn Gresham Elev8 Consortium to include: Perspectives Calumet Middle School, Access Community Health Network (ACCESS at Perspectives), and Saint Sabina's Employment Resource Center (ERC)-Center for Working Families (CWF).

In the end, the Auburn Gresham consortium wanted the new White House director of Urban Affairs to be reminded

of the significance of his calling to our community and send word back to President Barack Obama about the importance of partnering with community based organizations and institutions, thus offering extended day academic curriculum, affordable and quality healthcare, and social supports/wrap around services.

ayor Richard M. Daley accompanied with Federal Communications Commission Chairman, Julius Genachowski and host of other civic and community leaders unveiled the **Smart Communities Digital** Excellence Initiative aimed at reducing the digital divide in Chicago. This initiative is a collaboration of the City of Chicago, MacArthur Foundation, Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC/Chicago) and 'Smart Communities' Chicago neighborhoods: Auburn Gresham, Chicago Lawn, Englewood, Humboldt Park, and Pilsen.

Mayor Daley expressed in his comments that regardless of difficult economic times, the City of Chicago should be committed to address the challenges of the digital divide.

"Creating broadband infrastructure and access to technology in our neighborhoods is just as important to cities in the 21st century as paving streets and building water systems and utility systems that were in the 19th and 20th centuries," he said.

The Greater Auburn-Gresham Development Corporation's (GADC) & New Communities Program manager, Ernest Sanders and Julie Welborn, co-owner of Perfect Peace Cafe & Bakery offered remarks regarding the importance of the Smart Communities Initiative in Auburn Gresham.

Also during this press conference, Mayor Daley announced Microsoft's commitment of an additional \$1.03 million in software grants to non-profit organizations in the Smart Communities. He too spoke of Hewlett-Packard's (HP) support and their investment of TouchSmart PC's at key locations in the Smart Communities.

City Housing Delegates Convene

ADC held the 4th Quarter Housing Resource Center (HRC) South Region meeting for City of Chicago's Southside delegate agencies at Soul Food Unlimited restaurant. Guest speakers included GADC's own Tenisha Jones, Tom Raleigh of Pangea Real Estate, reverse mortgage specialist, Yvette LaGrande, and Richard Wooten of Wooten Security who gave useful information to delegates on how to safeguard homes and deter unwarranted activity in communities.

Litter Free Zone Provides Ecofriendly Job Opportunities Through the City of Chicago

ayor Richard M. Daley recently announced that the City of Chicago will receive funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) to create community-based green jobs for the hard-to-employ, including the formerly incarcerated over the next two years.

The City will use these funds to support two new green job training initiatives: the Green Job Work Experience and Community Green Jobs. Both programs were developed by the City and its non-profit and business partners.

The Greater Auburn-Gresham Development Corporation (GADC), a City delegate agency was selected based on several competitive requests for proposals (RFP).

GADC will receive funds through the Community Green Jobs initiative to help leverage and enhance its existing litter free program by providing up to 10 eco-friendly jobs.

Also as part of this partnership with the City, GADC's Green Ambassadors will be trained in the specifics of community-based litter prevention which includes a three step process to engage our residents in active recycling.

International Grocer Looks to End Food Desert in Auburn Gresham



nternational grocery retail store, ALDI opened a new 18,000 square foot store on the south side of Chicago at 7627 S. Ashland Avenue.

ALDI's in-store merchandise is similar if not better than other grocery competitors. They currently stock 1,400 commonly purchased items and have relationships with other food manufacturers. 98% of ALDI's merchandise is Select Brands. Select Brands are ALDI's private label, high quality and best value items.

ALDI as well is concerned about their customer's healthy consumption and offers merchandise under the "Fit and Active" label as well as 50-80 items of fresh produce.

ALDI also partnered with Auburn Gresham-based and Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) Ujamaa Construction as the general contractor. As a result, Ujamaa employed seven other qualified MBEs and Women Business Enterprises (WBE) representing 50% of the total cost of the project. They also worked with Saint Sabina Employment Resource Center to hired local residents from the 15th and 17th Aldermanic Wards.

The project was completed as scheduled before the Thanksgiving holiday to the delight of ALDI, and Ujamaa Construction Inc.
