strong community is not only anchored by its businesses, its homes, and residents, but also by the quality of its schools. Since 2003 the Greater Auburn-Gresham Development Corporation (GADC), in partnership with Local Initiatives Support Corporation of Chicago (LISC/Chicago), has invested many planning hours in improving neighborhood schools.

This significant investment has proven itself beneficial because 1) 110 high school seniors recently became the first graduating class of Perspectives Charter Schools-Calumet; 2) a partnership with The Atlantic Philanthropies leveraged the expertise of Access Community Health Networks and a new a school-based health center inside Perspectives servicing both Perspectives' students and local feeder schools, and now 3) a new joint venture with Illinois State University to bring the TEACHER+PLUS Project to Auburn Gresham in 2011.

The TEACHER+PLUS Project is a special initiative at Illinois State University that is open to all teacher education majors who have interests in pursuing employment in the Chicago Public Schools. The central goal of this initiative is to prepare teachers to work in this challenging urban context by providing them targeted course work, clinical experiences and unique internship opportunities.

The TEACHER+PLUS Project's clinical experience is especially valuable to Auburn Gresham because the teacher candidates will live in the community where their residency takes place.

What does this mean? It means in 2011 Auburn Gresham will have ISU teacher candidates not only working in our neighborhood schools, but also living here for one year, while completing their program.

While TEACHER+PLUS students are adding value to our neighborhood school during the day, they will lend a helping hand at GADC and other community organizations in Auburn Gresham during the evening.

GADC/GAIA Senior Summer Cleaning Day

n Friday June 25th the Greater Auburn-Gresham Development Corporation (GADC) in partnership with GAIA Movement held a senior citizen summer cleaning day.

Maximizing Financial Incentive **C** within the 79th Street Business

he Greater Auburn Gresham Development Corporation (GADC) has partnered with the Special Service Area (SSA) #32 and C Johnson & Associates to coordinate the city of Chicago's Façade Enhancement Program for businesses located within the 79th Street Business District.

The Façade Enhancement Program is designed to encourage local business owners to maximize financial incentives and improve the façade of their building. Eligible business owners receive free architectural services, grants ranging from \$500 to \$20,000, and technical assistance with completing grant application forms for the Small Business Improvement Fund (SBIF).


oby Williams' doctors told his mother that he would be brain dead and nothing but a vegetable if she proceeded to give
